Credential Committee – (*Seeking a Radiation Therapy Representative*)

To oversee all aspects of registration and licensure in accordance with the Act, Regulations and By-laws, to ensure registrants are credentialed, qualified and competent to practice

- To develop processes for assessing the eligibility of applicants for registration and licensure
- To ensure applicants and registrants meet the criteria required for registration and licensure
- To determine the ruling of an applicant's registration and/or licensure eligibility
- To determine conditions and restrictions of licensure
- To ensure registrants practice within their individual scope of practice
- To maintain currency/relevance of registration and application forms through annual review
- To establish tools for assessing competency and return to practice for members
- To construct criteria for continuing professional development credits
- To oversee compliance of mandatory continuing professional development
- To provide an annual report to the NSCMIRTP Board

Policy Committee – (*Seeking two MRT or Sonography Representatives*)

To ensure all policies, procedures, and positions created in accordance with the Act, Regulations and By-laws, are clear, current and documented

- To develop, review, analyze, revise and update the policies, procedures and position statements of the College in accordance with the Act, Regulations and By-laws as directed by the Board.
- To issue direction and/or guidelines on general principles and objectives, ensuring clarity, certainty and consistency
- To document operations and procedures
- To define standards for operational and administrative issues
- To distribute guidelines, position statements and policies to Communications Committee for public review
- To provide electronic copies of the policies and procedures manual to College members upon request
- To track and retain policies and procedures in both hardcopy and electronic formats
- To provide an annual report to the NSCMIRTP Board



Education Committee – (*Seeking a Nuclear Medicine Representative*)

To oversee educational functions, including conferences, lunch and learns, and awards, and to aid where necessary in planning and preparation of these functions.

1. To ensure fall conference venues are booked and attain speakers for sessions
2. To provide assistance when required for lunch and learns from all provincial sites
3. To provide assistance and support to provincial conference sites
4. To oversee awards program
5. To develop policies and processes related to education committee
6. To collect and provide feedback from AGC and fall education events
7. To provide annual report to NSCMIRTP Board

Fitness to Practice Committee – (*Seeking MRTs and Sonographers*)

This is a new committee that is just forming. Representation from all MRT groups and sonography is needed. The Fitness to Practice Committee will develop their terms of reference. The committee will be charged with developing the processes and criteria to be followed when allegations of member incapacity are received. Outside expertise will be provided where required to support committee in developing the required processes and criteria.
