

## Standard Registration Process

Submit application form, and documents to NSAMRT

Review by Registrar and/or Registration Committee to assess submitted documents;

- Proof of completion of a Canadian accredited educational program in radiography, nuclear medicine, magnetic resonance or radiation therapy
- Proof of clinical competency in one of the disciplines
- AIT form or letter of good standing if moving from another jurisdiction in Canada
- Proof of work as an MRT in one of the disciplines, or proof graduation from accepted program as (described above) within the last five years
- Confirmation of no criminal offense, professional misconduct, incompetency or incapacity
- Proof of language fluency
- Proof of PLI
- Pass jurisprudence module
- Proof of Canadian citizenship, residency or authorization to work in Canada
- Government issued photo ID
- Proof of criminal records check

Qualification Acceptable

Pay registration fees

Licensed to work as MRT in Nova Scotia

Qualification Not Acceptable  
Registration committee does not issue certificate of registration. Provides rational for refusal and requirements to reapply

Applicant addresses deficiencies and reapplies in timelines set out in original refusal notice

Application returns to Registrar and or Registration Committee to follow assessment process above.

Refusal rational does not allow for possibility of resubmission

Unable to practice as MRT in Nova Scotia
